Anti-Slavery & Human Trafficking Statement

Introduction

This statement sets out ECC Teoranta’s actions to understand potential Modern Slavery risks related to its business and to put in place steps that are aimed at ensuring there is no slavery or human trafficking in its own business and its supply chains. The Company is committed to preventing slavery and human trafficking in its corporate activities and to ensuring that its supply chains are free from slavery and human trafficking.

Our business and supply chains

The principal activities of ECC Teoranta is supplying quality construction, fencing and pallet timber products to the Irish and UK markets. ECC Teoranta employs over 120 full-time staff at the company’s Co. Galway site, with an additional 180 full-time staff contracted externally in the areas of timber felling, extraction and haulage.

The majority of the company’s suppliers are engaged with on a regular basis, enabling the company to have fewer and stronger supplier partnerships, which in turn enables us to have a greater knowledge of our business partners. We expect our supply chain to adhere to our core policies and values whilst working alongside us in a transparent and compliant relationship. Responsible procurement of raw material forms a core element of the company’s day to day management and policies. Fully accredited to the FSC (Forest Stewardship Council) and PEFC (Program for the Endorsement of Forest Certification), the company actively promotes sustainable forestry management with over 90% of raw material attaining FSC chain of custody.

The company remains committed to exercising vigilance at all times to the risk of slavery & trafficking activities and to ensure our reviews and evaluations of our suppliers are sufficiently thorough to maintain their effectiveness.

In keeping with our commitment to act with integrity in all our business dealings, many of our existing policies are relevant to ensure that there is no slavery or human trafficking in any part of our business or our supply chains. These policies include:
